



Statutory Framework for the Early Years Foundation Stage – September 2014 (Setting the Standards for Learning, Development and Care for children from birth to five years.)

In line with the EYFS Framework, Shincliffe C.E Primary School is required to obtain written parental permission at the time of a child's admission to school, should we need to seek any necessary '*Emergency medical advice or treatment*' in the future.

This does not replace our school policy for the Administration of Medication in school. Parents/ Carers will be required to complete an '*Administration of Medication Form*' each time that school is required to administer prescribed medication. This may be in line with a child's agreed '*Healthcare Plan*' or on an ad-hoc basis e.g. - a course of antibiotics.
